Pharmacy Technology Diploma Fall 2017 Admissions Information

***** Priority Review Deadline April 28, 2017 *****

***** Rolling Admission After April 29, 2017*****

Pharmacy Technology Diploma is a limited enrollment program that begins each fall semester. Applicants must meet minimum requirements and specific deadlines to be considered for admission. **Please note that meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.**

Applicants who meet the minimum requirements must meet with an admissions advisor for completion of a Pharmacy Technology Minimum Admissions Requirements (MAR) review. Admission will be offered to approximately 30-40 students each year. Once the class has filled, an alternate list of students will be compiled. An alternate will be admitted to the program when an admitted student declines admission. Applicants denied admission must re-apply and complete a new MAR review if they wish to be considered for the Fall 2018 program.

Your official program of study while working on pre-requisites for the Pharmacy Technology program is Associate in General Education (AGE). AGE is an Associate degree program for students who are interested in pursuing a program of study in general education. This curriculum provides an introduction to the liberal arts and enables the student to tailor the program beyond that point to meet their personal needs and interests. Once you have been selected into Pharmacy Technology, the admissions office will change your major. If you are not selected, you are welcome to update your Limited Enrollment status and continue taking classes in AGE or change you major to a non-limited enrollment program.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- ___ 1. Submit the GTCC Application.
- ___ 2. Take the GTCC placement test, if required by the Admissions Office.
- ___ 3. Submit official high school transcript or GED scores to Enrollment Services.
(Official transcripts are sealed in an envelope with the school's seal or original signature).
- ___ 4. Submit official transcripts from all colleges or schools attended since high school to Enrollment Services. These will be reviewed for possible transfer credit.

MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

1. **Completed Admissions File** (refer to front page)

2. **Course Eligibility Requirements**

Applicants must be eligible to register for college-level English and Math. Below lists the different measures used to determine college-level readiness.

Placement test scores are valid for five years. Applicants not meeting these minimum scores should enroll in the appropriate developmental courses. To be considered for admission, all developmental courses must be completed by May 21st, 2015. College English or Algebra courses with a grade of “C” or higher may waive some of the tests. Acceptable SAT, ACT, PLAN, or PSAT scores within the past five years may also waive the need for placement testing, as well as an unweighted high school GPA of 2.6 or higher*. Please see an Admissions Officer to determine the need for placement testing. See scores below for SAT, ACT, PLAN and PSAT.

* Must meet specific high school course requirements high school GPA consideration. High school GPA no later than 5 years past the graduation dated noted on the transcript.

* Applicants who have completed DRE coursework must be eligible to register for college-level English prior to completing their MAR Review.

3. **Minimum Admissions Requirements (MAR) Review**

After completion of the minimum requirements applicants must meet with an admissions advisor to complete the Minimum Admissions Requirements (MAR) review. The Admissions Office is located in Enrollment Services on the Jamestown Campus. (No appointment necessary).

Notification Procedure

Students will be admitted to the program based on the completion date of the MAR review. Letters will be mailed to those who complete a MAR review (accepted, alternates and/or declines). Applicants not admitted to the program who wish to be considered for the next year must submit a new application and complete a new MAR review.

Please note: A person is not eligible to sit for the Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam (PTCE) if convicted of a felony that occurred within the last five years and/or if the conviction was drug or pharmacy-related.

Please note: Upon admission, students will be required to have a criminal background check, a drug screen, and an OIG review (Office of Inspector General). Healthcare agencies that are utilized for clinical and/or internship experiences require this evaluation. Students with positive checks and/or screenings will be denied clinical experience in the healthcare agency. If a student is denied agency access, there will be no placement at an alternate site, and the subsequent inability of the student to complete their clinical education will result in their inability to continue in the health science program.
